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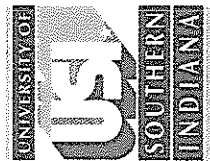

## What is Faith Community Nursing?

Faith Community Nursing is a specialized nursing practice of health ministry. It emphasizes health and healing within the faith community and the larger community. The philosophy of the curriculum embraces four major concepts:

- The Spiritual Dimension
- Professionalism
- Wholistic Health
- Community

## Program Description

This program is designed for the participant to complete the first half of the program, Part 1, in an online instruction format in their own home or office within the designated time period prior to the retreat portion of the program. The online portion of program is estimated to take 11 to 12 hours to complete. Part 2 is a live program conducted in a retreat setting.

The focus of the program is on the development of the knowledge, attitudes, and skills that are central to the faith community nurse role. The content is the basic parish nurse curriculum of the International Parish Nurse Resource Center.

## Program Objectives

At the close of the program, the participant will:

- Identify strategies for integrating concepts of faith and health in the faith community nurse role
- Demonstrate knowledge, attitude, and skills to practice as a beginning faith community nurse
- Identify a network for continuing development and support
- Identify ways to nurture personal spiritual development

## Target Audience

This program is designed for registered nurses and students enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program who are interested in working or volunteering in a faith community nursing role.
